SEE

QUESTIONS

- Who is being affected and what impact is it having?
- Why is this issue happening (what's the cause?)

THINK

Evaluate your thoughts on the social justice issue and reflect on your own values and beliefs.

QUESTIONS

- What has been your experience with this issue?
- What do your own personal beliefs/values say about this issue?

DO

Identify short term goals, the ideal change, the steps needed, who is involved and the action to be taken.

QUESTIONS

- What are some of the things already being done to address this issue?
- How are you going to bring awareness to this issue?
- What is your message and call to action?

OPENING PRAYER

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, Amen.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Spirit and renew the face of the earth.

O God, by the light of the Holy Spirit, teach the hearts of the faithful and grant that by the same Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolation.

Through Christ Our Lord.

CLOSING PRAYER

REFLECTION

In 1833 when Frederic Ozanam gathered in Paris with his friends in an attempt to show the relevance of the Catholic faith, he was inspired to simply 'do a little good'.

Who would have thought that a 22 year old man could ignite a fire in so many others who found meaning in reaching out to those less fortunate. Whilst the appearance of the firewood has changed, that same passion to help others, that same passion to live our faith in action, that same passion to love God with the sweat of our brow and the strength of our arms, continues in us who carry on this same mission.

Today there are still great needs in our local communities. Today we still carry firewood in the footsteps of Frederic Ozanam. As we carry firewood into the future, we are not sure of the emerging poverties that await us. Yet what we do know, is that to ensure our vibrant future there will always be a need for men and women, young and old, to share the mission of Frederic Ozanam.

The need to live our Catholic faith through tangible gestures of love in action will always be necessary.
